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U. Faulkner and T. Wolf, P. Koelo and Ch. Yes, the synthesis of philosophy and art, science and fiction is the main feature of an intellectual novel. This synthesis was manifested in the growth of mythological thinking in the artistic reincarnation of the historical period, in the perception of myths as a universal model of human life and a recurring law, going beyond the mere symbolic framework.
