In the scientific literature published during the years of independence, Uzbek scientists have given a number of definitions of the concept of "nation". Including, J. Bahronov writes about it: "A nation is a stable unity of people who share a common language, territory, mind, spirit and spirituality" [1]. It is obvious that in the definition of the concept of nation here more attention is paid to its spiritual aspects, although the nation is a phenomenon that reflects the peculiarly complex aspects of the social being. In turn, N. Nazarov defines "Nation - a period of qualitative development of humanity, a qualitatively integrated, general national character of the ethnos" [2]., just. Although these aspects of this definition have a special significance in revealing the essence of the nation, they do not serve to fully cover the new socio-spiritual and cultural image of the nation today.

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The system of values, which is an expression of national values and their interdependence, moves the nation from the past to the future through a series of histories, modern trends, various social and political processes. These values are more related to the ethnic characteristics and ethnic space of the nation. The social development of nations continues inextricably linked with the development of their national and ethnic values.

National values differ from universal values in that they constitute a set of interests of a particular nation or people. The values of one nation may not be accepted by another nation Nevertheless, it is spirituality for each nation to respect the values that have become valuable to another nation. After all, the core of spirituality is national, universal and personal values. When it comes to national values, it is important to recognize the values created by individuals. Numerous examples from the history of our people prove that the values of individuals can rise to the level of both national and universal values.
